

Display questions	Referential questions
These are designed to elicit learners' prior knowledge and to check comprehension. They often focus on the form or meaning of language structures and items, and the teacher already knows the answer.	These require the learner to provide information, give an opinion, explain or clarify. They often focus on content rather than language, require 'follow-up' or 'probe' questions, and the answer is not necessarily known by the teacher.
What colour is it?	What would you like to know about?
Is this a door?	How do you come to school?
What's the opposite of?	What do you think will happen next?
Where do adjectives go in English?	Why did we play the game?







#### **Effective questioning**

#### A suggested check-list:

- Decide on the purpose of questions.
- Minimise the use of "yes / no" (closed) questions except when checking meaning and understanding.
- Ask a balance of referential and display questions.
- Use open-ended questions to encourage opinions, elaboration and discussion.
- Ask questions about important rather than trivial content.
- Grade language.
- Personalise questions.
- Avoid questions that contain the answer.
- Make sure that children clearly understand questions.
- Spread questions randomly around the class.
- Balance questions to the whole class with individual child nomination. Create opportunities for children to formulate and ask questions.
- <u>Give children time (thinking-time) to answer. Don't be afraid of silence wait at least 3/5 seconds for them to formulate a response.</u>








#### Remember!

There is way more to asking questions than the common classification into 'wh', 'yes/no' questions. This is often how children are taught and how they divide them. Good questioning provides a model which hopefully will foster good questions from learners.

The questions 'Do you understand?', 'Is that clear?' and 'OK?' are unlikely to provoke a helpful response. It is also wise to avoid questions which may cause embarrassment or which may offend through sarcasm ('Are you awake?').


Allow students to help each other. If a child cannot answer your question do not wait in silence and humiliate them. Rephrase your question or ask them a further question to lead them towards the information you need.

Encourage others to suggest answers. Allow answers to be whispered to help — make this rule clear at the start of the activity. Do not settle for one correct response. Get suggestions from more students, involving the whole class.




























