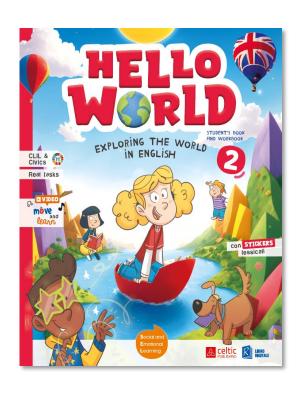






# TPR as a language teaching method

It is important to eat a healthy diet with enough protein to help muscles grow properly. We find protein in meat, fish, eggs and beans.



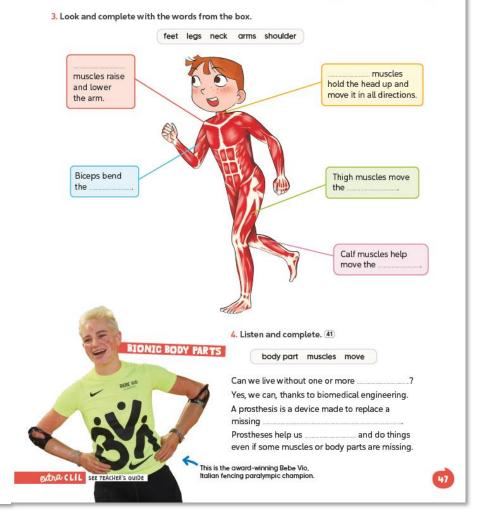

# **Roads to Rome**

#### the Romans in Britain



The name Britain comes from Britannia, the name given to the country by the Romans.

When the Romans arrive in Britain in 55 BC led by Julius Caesar, they start to build roads, fortresses, villas and thermal baths. They stay for almost 400 years.

The Romans change the way of life in Britain: they found many towns which still exist today. York, Bath, Winchester, Manchester, Chester and Lancaster are all Roman cities.

The names ending in –chester, –cester or –caster derive from the Latin word *castrum*, meaning "fortification".
